Danish contractor Ziton will be carrying out this work using the jack up vessel 'Wind' due to commence within the next 2 weeks, weather dependent.

The works will be carried out in stages.

The first visit to the site will be for removal of the lattice met mast structure, and then if the weather window allows, the platform will be removed.

If the platform is removed at this time it will necessitate the navigation lantern being repositioned to the top of the remaining monopile.

The company carrying out the works has consulted Trinity House and has obtained their acceptance of this lantern move.

The second visit to the site will be to remove the monopile.

The internal parts of the monopile will be excavated to allow for the pile to be cut 35m below the existing platform level. This ensures that the embedded length will be below seabed level as required by the licence.

The licence requires for a survey to be carried out within 3 months of completion.

Both phases are due to be completed by the end of 2016, though this is subject to operating conditions and the decommissioning vessels planned works.
